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

#### AUG. 14 - FLIGHTS DEPART U.S.

#### AUG. 16 – TANZANIA'S BIRD LIFE Set out for a four-night safari\* to Ngorongoro

Crater, traveling through Lake Manyara National Park, with its multitude of birds, including great birds of prey. Arrive at Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge, built directly on the rim of "Africa's Eden," Ngorongoro Crater. **Meals BLD** 

#### AUG. 17 – NGORONGORO CRATER Explore the "lost world" of dormant Ngorongoro Crater aboard a four-by-four. Inside its walls, grasslands, swamps, forests and a freshwater lake mean you'll have an opportunity to spot



Africa's renowned *Big Five* – buffalo, elephant, leopard, the black-maned lion and the black rhino. A picnic lunch in the crater will be a highlight of your day. **Meals BLD** 

#### Aug. 18 – Olduvai Gorge

Visit Olduvai Gorge where archaeologists Louis and Mary Leakey discovered the fossils of some of the earliest known human species. Enjoy game viewing on the drive to Serengeti National Park. Be prepared for bumps along unpaved roads as well as the pampering to follow at your safari lodge. **Meals BLD** 

AUG. 19 – SERENGETI NAT'L PARK Morning and afternoon game drives take you into the golden Serengeti savanna where you may spot numerous prides of lions, as well as zebras,



gazelles, elephants, and hippos. Enjoy an evening against the backdrop of an African sunset, with a leisurely dinner of pan-African cuisine. **Meals BLD** 

#### Aug. 20 - Amboseli National Park

Fly to Arusha to explore sights near Kilimanjaro National Park, where the skyline is dominated by 15,000-ft. high Mount Kilimanjaro. Then head to Kenya for a two-night stay in Amboseli National Park, where grasslands attract free-ranging elephants and other wildlife. This afternoon, visit a Maasai village near the lodge. **Meals BLD** 

#### Aug. 21 - Private Game Drives

Wake up in the heart of Amboseli. Elephants, hippos and buffaloes frequent nearby emerald-green swamps and grazing antelopes can be spotted in the flat grasslands. **Meals BLD** 

#### Aug. 22 – Wildlife Conservation

Fly to the Fairmont Mount Kenya Safari Club, located directly on the Equator and co-founded in 1959 as a secluded haven for the glitterati by the late movie star, William Holden. See a demonstration of the Equator's effect on water flow and visit the orphanage and education center where wild animals are cared for before being returned to their natural habitats. **Meals BLD** 

#### Aug. 23 - Chimpanzee Sanctuary

Visit the private OI Pejeta Conservancy, where highly endangered chimpanzees, rescued from traumatic situations, are nursed back to health to enjoy the rest of their days in a vast natural reserve. In addition

to chimps, the reserve boasts tropical vegetation, all of the "Big Five" animals and views of snow-capped Mt. Kenya across the bush. **Meals BLD** 

#### AUG. 24 - VILLAGE WEAVERS

See local villagers shear, spin, dye and weave sheeps' wool to create colorful rugs, sweaters and shawls on a visit to Nanyuki, a Kenyan market town and base for those seeking to climb Mount Kenya. Return to your resort for an afternoon at leisure, enjoying swimming, tennis, lawn-bowling and more. **Meals BLD** 

#### Aug. 25 – Masai Mara Reserve

Enjoy a two-night stay in tented accommodations at the Fairmont Mara Safari Club, surrounded on three sides by the Mara River. Fly from Nanyuki to the Masai Mara. Spend the afternoon as you wish before an evening game drive on the Mara plains. **Meals BLD**
