



UNESCO

Historic Cairo, Ancient Thebes with its Necropolis, The Pyramid Fields and the Monuments from Abu Simbel to Philae are all UNESCO World Heritage sites featured in this program. These sites are distinguished for their universal scenic, historic, artistic or scientific value.

CAIRO

Situated on the fertile banks of the Nile, Egypt's capital is also the largest city on the African continent. Dating from A.D. 640, this sprawling metropolis is a showcase of antiquity from the pharaonic era and reveals a wealth of magnetic fascinations for the visitor. This is where the Christian, Muslim and ancient worlds converge. Of Cairo's many amazing sites, perhaps the most renowned is the esteemed Egyptian Museum. Housing the world's largest collection of Egyptian and Roman relics, the most famous of the museum's innumerable riches are the 3,300-year-old treasures from the tomb of King Tutankhamen. Among the artifacts are his elaborate gold coffin and finely detailed gold throne. A modern city teeming with contemporary pleasures, Cairo is also the gateway to Giza where the spectacular Pyramids and enigmatic Sphinx stand on the edge of desert sands. Nearby is Sakkara, a necropolis containing hundreds of Egyptian tombs and home to the world's first pyramid, the Step Pyramid of Zozer.


CHICAGO HOUSE

During your stay in Luxor, an exclusive visit to the Chicago House has been arranged to see the Chicago House Method of documentation, preservation and conservation. Founded in 1924, the University of Chicago's **Oriental Institute's Chicago House** has completed epigraphic surveys of important archaeological sites in and around Luxor. The Chicago House Method consists of photographing a surface and printing the image on a coated paper that can be drawn on. After all the details have been sketched, the paper is immersed into an iodine bath that erases the photograph, but keeps the drawings, creating a detailed blueprint of the monument and its intricate carvings. This specially arranged visit will showcase the unique process and allow you to see and learn about their work firsthand. Luxor

Once the capital of the Egyptian Empire — then called Thebes — today, Luxor is one of Egypt's most popular destinations. The magnificent temples in and about the city are the result of successive pharaohs wing to outdo each other's legacies. The sprawling complex of Karnak Temple, with its avenue of ram-headed sphinxes, and the Temple of Luxor are two of the most majestic architectural achievements of the ancient world. A short trip across the Nile brings you to the Valleys of the Kings and Queens. Hidden from view, beneath the sweeping sands and golden dunes, is an incredible labyrinth of corridors that served as the secret tombs of the pharaohs and their families for centuries. Colorful hieroglyphics and painted scenes meant to assist the pharaoh on his journey into the afterlife — are still vividly visible on many of the chamber walls. Astounding in their clandestine and detailed construction, these fascinating tombs are among Egypt's most memorable monuments.



NILE RIVER CRUISE

To explore the heart of Egypt, you must sail the sacred waters of the Nile, as did the pharaohs and their courtiers thousands of years ago. En route, marvel at astounding vestiges of bygone civilizations. Visit Edfu, site of the well-preserved 2,000-year-old temple dedicated to the hawk god, Horus. See the imposing twin temples of the falcon and crocodile gods at Kom Ombo. Glide past the storied Egypt of your imagination — feluccas float serenely across the Nile's gentle waves with their canvas sails silhouetted by a crimson sunset; turbaned men prod stubborn water buffaloes through lush fields; grey

herons tiptoe cautiously among the tall papyri that line the riverbanks; fishermen balance in narrow skiffs as they cast their nets into the water. All of this is yours to behold amid the superb comfort and luxurious surroundings of the Sonesta St. George I cruise ship.

ASWAN

The large granite rocks and islands that rise from the Nile's gentle currents near Aswan are said to resemble elephants bathing in the water. Appropriately, the largest of these is named Elephantine Island and is the location of several Nubian villages where welcoming residents maintain traditional customs and languages. Of course, Aswan has its fair share of ruins, among them the Temple of Philae. Dedicated to Isis, the goddess of healing and fertility, this beautiful complex is poised on the island of Agilkia, just ahead of the Nile River's first of six cataracts.



ABU SIMBEL

The great Pharaoh Ramses II left as his legacy two of the most tremendous monuments constructed in the ancient world — the Great and Small Temples of Abu Simbel. Massive figures of Ramses decorate the façade of the Great Temple, which, along with the Small Temple, was at one time in danger of being lost forever to the rising waters of Lake Nasser. In an engineering feat almost as incredible as the temples themselves, the structures were



cut into 2,000 pieces and moved, slab by slab, to a site 700 feet away from, and over 200 feet higher than, the original location. Flawlessly reconstructed, the temples stand today as a dual testimony to human ingenuity.




