Excursion: Highlights of Prague. Admire the many historic landmarks of Prague, a medieval city spared from the destructive wars of the 20th century. Explore the Strahov

Catholic Monastery, one of Prague's most ancient landmarks, and enjoy an exclusive visit to the Philosophical and Theological Halls of the monastery's library. Stand in Prague Castle's gothic Vitus' Cathedral, built in 1344 by Holy Roman Emperor and Czech King Charles IV, and marvel at the haunting stained glass in the spiritual heart of the city. Sail the Vltava River, stroll the gothic Charles Bridge and examine its 30 statuaries, and discover Old Town Square's famous Astronomical Clock and wealth of Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance and baroque façades.

Local Flavor: Savor classic Czech cuisine at a restaurant situated on a hillside beneath Prague Castle. Enjoy the restaurant's garden terraces, vineyards and spectacular views of the Old Town and the Vltava River.

Go deeper into the work of Czech art nouveau artist Alphonse Mucha with a visit to the Mucha Museum, which features the time the artist spent in Paris designing posters for Sarah Bernhardt.

Architectural Prague

While Prague is a living museum of a thousand years of European architecture, perhaps its most exciting period was the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when Czech architects looked to art nouveau, which had originated in 1890s Paris. Emphasizing a mix of naturalistic but stylized forms and geometric shapes, art nouveau was a welcome departure from the formal lines of neoclassical buildings, and Prague is rich with its influence, especially in New Town and the Jewish Quarter. After World War I, Art Deco emerged as a complement to the opulent Jazz Age, featuring geometric, bold shapes wrought from modern materials like steel and chrome. The famous Art Deco Imperial Hotel, built in 1914, is home to the equally legendary Café Imperial. Once frequented by writer Franz Kafka and composer Leoš Janáček, this beautiful space is decorated with elaborate oriental- and Moorish-inspired mosaic and relief work, and it proudly operates today as one of Prague's finest restaurants.

Laterna Magika

This theater has an important and celebrated role in recent Czech history. Known as the "war room" where Czech president Václav Havel and other intellectuals planned the peaceful overthrow of the Communist government in 1989, the theater in its original location near Wenceslas Square was the site of 10 nights of debates among striking actors and artists rallying the masses to democratic freedom during the Velvet Revolution. When the Politburo resigned, celebrations erupted in the streets. Today the theater, located in a wing of the National Theater, hosts performance art shows of music, film, light and dance. The multimedia shows, often comedies written by Czech playwrights, are entertaining for audiences of any language.


