

### BEIJING | XI'AN

**Dinner Show.** Xi'an, cosmopolitan capital of the Tang Dynasty (618-907), was an important city on the Silk Road. Positioned on the crossroads of commerce and culture, Xi'an's affluence and influence grew. The arts flourished as rulers embraced the many cultures introduced to the city. This excursion highlights the culture of this Chinese Golden Age. Try regional cuisine and enjoy the culture of this period in Chinese history.




