YOUR ITINERARY

DAY 1 ~ BALTIMORE/ANCHORAGE

HOTEL CAPTAIN COOK. (D)

Board your flight from Baltimore to the vast wilderness of Alaska via Anchorage. Your home for the next four nights is the well appointed Hotel Captain Cook, which offers comfortable rooms and spectacular views of local landscapes. The hotel offers a variety of dining choices and an athletic club with a fitness room, classes, a swimming pool, and Jacuzzi.

DAY 2 ~ ANCHORAGE

HOTEL CAPTAIN COOK. (B,D)

Begin the day with a tour of the Anchorage Museum for an immersion into all things Alaskan. One of the museum's most popular exhibits is the Alaska Gallery, a 15,000 square-foot exhibit devoted to Alaska's history. Explore the city in the afternoon at your own pace. In the evening rub elbows with the mushers at the Musher's Banquet at the Dena'ina Center, and observe as they choose starting positions by drawing names out of a boot.

DAY 3 ~ ANCHORAGE

HOTEL CAPTAIN COOK. (B)

Today is at leisure and you are free to create your own personal itinerary for a tour of Anchorage, or you may choose to participate in one of the available optional activities at an additional cost.

- Full-day Adventure to Dog Sledding Country: Learn the musher's tricks of the sledding trade from an experienced musher, then meet the young pups that may one day pull a sled in the Iditarod and watch them demonstrate their sled pulling skills. Price: \$350 per person. Depart at approximately 8:00 AM and return at approximately 3:00 PM. Lunch is included. (Rates subject to change)
- Alaska's Great Outdoors: Take a short dog-sled ride, then participate in a light snowshoe trek through
 wooded trails in the morning. The reward for you efforts are campfire prepared s'mores! Price: \$275
 per person. Depart at 9:30 AM and return at 12:30 PM, or depart 11:00 AM and return at 2:00 PM. (Rates
 subject to change)
- Turnagain Arm Winter Adventure: Begin your journey with a road trip down the scenic Seward Highway to Girdwood for exceptional wildlife viewing. Ride the Alyeska Resort Aerial Tram to the top of Mt. Alyeska, then visit the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center. There you will see Wood Bison plod through 65 acres of tidal flat terrain as part of a conservation effort to reintroduce the species back into the wild. Price: \$200 per person. (Rates subject to change)

DAY 4 ~ IDITAROD CEREMONIAL START

KNIK RIVER LODGE. (B,D)

Today you will be present for the ceremonial start of the 900-mile-long Iditarod. Early risers will be rewarded with the sights and sounds of teams as they prepare for the beginning of the race. Watch as teams charge down 4th Street on the first leg of the race. After seeing this exciting event, drive into the wilderness along the Knik River to your home for the evening, near the Knik Glacier. Your home for the night, the Knik River Lodge, is surrounded by spectacular wilderness. The lodge offers comfortable cabins, while fresh and delicious local meals are served in a yurt—a circular domed tent that makes for a truly unique experience.

DAY 5 ~ IDITAROD/WILLOW/ANCHORAGE

HOTEL CAPTAIN COOK. (B)

Travel to Wasilla and visit the Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race Headquarters for a musher's tutorial before heading to Willow for the official start of the race. Then travel along the Knik River, which is fed by the melting of the Knik Glacier. The river road twists its way through the rugged landscape and offers spectacular views around every curve, including Pioneer Peak, which stands 6,398 feet in the Chugach Range. Make your way back toward Anchorage today via a scenic route.

DAY 6 ~ ANCHORAGE/BALTIMORE

(B, Meals Aloft)

In Anchorage you will board a flight home. Arrive home in the early morning, with a touch of the wild still clinging to you.







Travel back to Anchorage via a scenic route and bid adieu to your fellow travelers as they depart. Board a small charter plane on a flight to Rainy Pass, an Iditarod checkpoint some 150 miles from the starting point. See mushers as they come and go on their quest to finish the race. Enjoy lunch before heading back to Anchorage for your flight home.

HOW TO BOOK: Fill out the reservation form and send it to Classic Escapes Inc. 58-25 Queens Blvd., Woodside NY, 11377, together with a deposit of \$500 per person for the main program and \$250 per person for the extension. Make checks out to Classic Escapes. Upon receipt of your signed reservation form and deposit, we will, subject to availability, reserve your place on your tour. When we send off your confirmation invoice, your booking is confirmed and accepted by us. Final documents will be sent to you approximately two weeks prior to departure.

RATES: Rates are based on the minimum number of guests outlined in this document (15), plus airfare costs and other

factors and are based on the minimum number of guests outlined in this document (15), plus airrare costs and other factors and are subject to change. If the minimum number of travelers is not met, Classic Escapes will do its best to still operate the trip. Though it is rare for Classic Escapes to make a price adjustment after promotion of an itinerary, we do reserve the right to assess a surcharge if the minimum is not met, or if increases are forced upon us by airlines or other partners.
